Representatives of the Illinois Student Assistant Commission will help students and their families fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). All students who wish to apply for financial aid for college must fill out this form. The FAFSA will be completed on laptop

computers, so attendees need to have basic computer skills. Although geared toward high school seniors, non-traditional students are welcome to register as well. Available college funds may deplete quickly and students are encouraged to fill out the FAFSA as soon as possible.

Registration is required for the individual filling out the FAFSA. Family members are welcome to attend, but only the applicant needs to register for the program.
