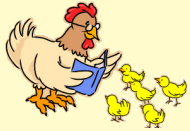

Tuesdays, 10:00-11:30 a.m.

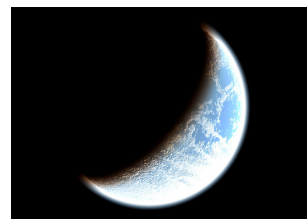
All ESL learners are invited to drop in to practice conversational English. No sign-up or preparation is necessary. This is an ongoing program offered in partnership with Literacy DuPage.
