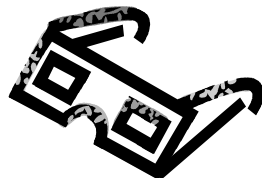

When you come to the Library to browse, do homework or work on projects, here are a few reminders.

**Always carry your Library card...**you never know when you'll find a book or other item that you just *have* to check out.

**Bring all the supplies you will need,** such as paper, pencils and pens, colored pencils and markers. Librarians will let you use some supplies like the stapler and small amounts of tape.

**Carry some change.** There is a pay phone in the lobby. Local calls cost about 80¢.
