Saturday Chess

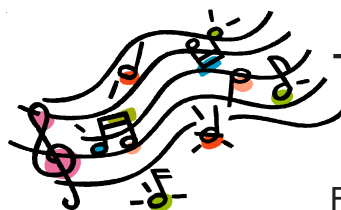
October 20 and November 17

Thursday, November 15

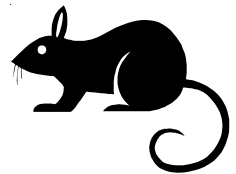
