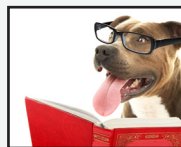

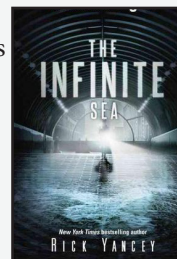

Food for Fines

Friday, April 1–Friday, April 15

Reduce your library fines and help others at the same time – it's a no brainer! From April 1–15, each non-perishable food item donated will clear \$1 in overdue fines or processing fees, up to a maximum of \$15. Suggested items to donate include canned soups, canned fruits and vegetables, pasta and pasta sauces, rice, cereal, and jars of peanut butter and jelly. Donated items cannot be used to waive charges for lost or damaged materials or purchases applied to your account. The Library reserves the right to reject items, such as those that are expired or have damaged packaging. The food we collect will go to the Community-wide Food Drive sponsored by the Rotary Club of Carol Stream. Everyone's help is welcome: you don't have to have fines to pay in order to donate food!

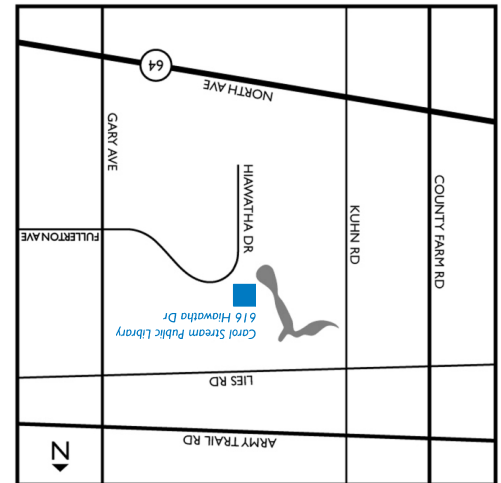
