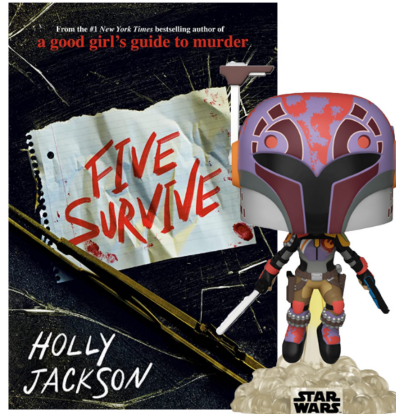
## FOR ADULTS
